The organization was created from the beginning with two specific goals: to help poor children and women who are sick in Africa and the second objective is to promote social coalitions and meeting in Nederland.

It was a big challenge and difficult for me to accomplish this goals as a single mother and also black migrant woman, to get the organization back to where it is today, but i have absolutely no regrets to be good!

So in 2002 I decided to take a step back and create my own company . Impact of Activities/ Projects

MISA has made a powerful impact throughout the years, transforming lives and communities across the Netherlands and Congo. MISA's work continues to create hope and opportunity for thousands of people. Below are some of the incredible impacts we've achieved together.

More than 300

community members, youth and adults, have access to gender-focused training and other courses at our community center.

More than 100

Women, A 50% success rate for girls in the first year of the tailoring exams, with a waiting list of 314 students for this training.

More than 300

students have benefited from tuition fees for a basic and first-rate education at schools in Congo-Kinshasa.

More than 30.000

people reached by our social coalition activities in Rotterdam

More than 150

adult expats successfully completed the Dutch language course program for the 2023-2025 academic year at our misa Delft training center

More than 350

children aged 0-18 living in Delft, South Holland, participated in the holiday activities offered by the Misa foundation.

More than 500

young people are waiting to be trained in fish and chicken farming, cooking classes, aesthetics classes, and the midwifery course.

More than 30.000

people are eagerly awaiting the installation of three drinking water wells for community members. One well costs us €5,000.

More than 50

young people who have been raped have come to our center to request medical and legal assistance. €1,500 per girl for medical care and the opening of a legal case.

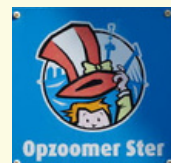
